Contacting parents				<p><b>Google Voice</b></p> <p>Free internet calling service: Google Voice gives you a free number and will forward it to any verified phone number you provide.</p> <p>It lets you place outgoing calls, with the Google Voice number listed as the caller ID. This works by having you enter the number you want to call and then the service calls your cell phone to connect the call.</p> <p>There are also a variety of ways to handle incoming calls, including screening. This is helpful because it not only avoids giving out your “real” number but it still allows families to call you back.</p> <p>This method typically avoids unlisted number blocking issues, though keep in mind some phones block phone numbers not in the users’ address book, so you may want to let families</p>

				<p>know what number you'll be calling for and having them add it to their address book.</p> <p>Once the coronavirus crisis is over, you can either keep the number active but forward all calls to your school phone or make it accept incoming voicemail only.</p>
