
How to search the directory

The Find a Professional Directory is formed from <u>Guild</u> members who have been awarded designatory letters in recognition of their qualifications*, and have committed to undertake regular professional development to improve their personal practice and to uphold <u>The Dyslexia Guild Code of Practice</u>.

What is an Assessment Practising Certificate (APC)?

Associate FE/HE Member (Further Education/Higher Education) are professional members and support tutors in Further and Higher Education colleges and universities or adult education. They can offer tuition and study skills support for those aged 16 years or older.

<u>Associate Members</u> (ADG) are professional members and specialist teachers with a teaching qualification in dyslexia/SpLD who can offer specialist tuition for those both under or over 16 years.

<u>Members</u> (MDG) are professional members and specialist teacher assessors with a specialist teacher/assessor qualification in dyslexia/SpLD who can offer both specialist tuition and assessment for those both under or over 16 years.

<u>Fellows</u> (FDG) are professional members and specialist teachers/assessors with a specialist teacher/assessor qualification in dyslexia/SpLD. They hold a minimum of two years teaching/tutoring/lecturing and 4 years assessment post qualification date. They can offer both specialist tuition and assessment for those both under or over 16 years.

Holding an APC confirms members have the knowledge, skills and competences to assess the detailed requirements of individuals with dyslexia/SpLD. These skills are reevaluated every three years. Only APC holders can undertake diagnostic assessment reports accompanying Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) applications to access support for further education at college or university. The Dyslexia Guild, PATOSS (Professional Association of Teachers Of Students With Specific Learning Difficulties) and BDA (British Dyslexia Association) are the professional bodies with whom the members hold their current APC.
